



SEED BORROWING PROCEDURE

1. Choose your seeds. You may borrow as many packets as you think you will use this season.
2. Please remember the **Community Seed Connection** is not intended to be your complete source of seeds for your entire garden.
3. Take seeds from any category, even if you are a new gardener or a new seed-saver.
4. Grow your seeds! Growing information is available from our Community Seed Connection webpage or in the seed library binder. Black and white photocopies are 10 cents each and color copies are 25 cents.



SEED RETURN PROCEDURE

We accept seeds all year long. The more we get, the bigger our selection will be next year.

1. Save your seeds. Resources for seed saving are in the binder and on our Community Seed Connection webpage.
2. Be sure to dry seeds thoroughly and store them in a cool, dry, dark place.
3. Save some seeds for yourself and return some seeds from your harvest to the library in a sealed paper envelope with as much information as you can. Example - plant name, variety, and year of harvest
4. Returning seeds is not required, but it will keep our Community Seed Connection sustainable. Please try to return more seeds than you borrowed, and only return seed that you are confident was not cross-pollinated. Resources are available in the binder.
5. If you cannot return seeds, please consider donating 1 or 2 packs of open-pollinated, non-GMO, non-hybrid seeds. Check the seed packet for this information.
